

#### OUTREACH

In the six weeks of Lent, we are highlighting three charities, with two weeks devoted to each; we hope to collect money or donated goods or both for each charity by the end of its two-week period. Please prayerfully consider service and charitable giving as a part of your Lenten spiritual discipline, perhaps setting aside a dollar a day for these charities (or a dollar a day for each charity!) through the forty days, and praying as you do so for those they serve.

First two weeks: Open Arms Domestic Violence and Rape Crisis Services, a forty-year-old Findlay organization with an emergency shelter, advocacy and education services, a crisis hotline, and a facility for safe family visitations. Last year they served well over 14,000 people in these capacities. Donate at openarmsfindlay.com. Wish list includes children's socks and underwear, adult sweatshirts and sweatpants, juice boxes, baby formula, H.A.T.S. tickets, and new (non-violent) toys.

Second two weeks: US Together Inc. of Toledo, a regional branch of a national organization serving refugees fleeing violence around the world. They provide language and citizenship classes, home and job placement, and intensive case management for the most traumatized. Donate at ustogether us. In-kind wish list includes household goods and furniture.

Third two weeks: Children's Mentoring Connection, another Findlay charity, this one providing free, individualized, professionally monitored mentoring in life skills, problem solving, building confidence, competence, and kindness for children primarily from single-parent homes. Donate at cmchancock.org. Wish list includes craft supplies and art supplies, poster boards, movie passes, and scrapbook paper.

#### THE RECTOR WRITES...



I am excited to inform you that an opportunity is in the works for Trinity to both contribute to and be the beneficiary of our connection to the larger church. Many of you will remember Brian Bechtel who served as our seminarian intern two summers ago. Brian, you may know has been a transitional deacon (that is, he has been ordained to the diaconate on the way to being ordained to the priesthood) for the last eight months, serving at St. Paul's, Cleveland Heights. That particular role is coming to its conclusion (will have done, by the time you are reading this), and the bishop is keen on his having a new experience of ministry and of continued education and formation as he, God willing, approaches ordination to the priesthood.

Conversations are now taking place between Deacon Brian, Bishop Hollingsworth, Canon for Ministry Percy Grant, St. John's, Bowling Green Senior Warden Pat Patton and your rector about an opportunity for Brian to continue that process in companionship with both St. John's and Trinity. We are fortunate here to have a fund established by Ruth Helvie some fifteen years ago to support an endeavor such as this, and we are also fortunate that the great majority of this proposition (should all the pieces fall into place, as it were) will be offset by diocesan funds.

Two summers ago Brian's primary role was simply to shadow me to get a more intensive experience of the day-to-day life of a priest. You may express your condolences to him for having been put through that experience. The role this time round would be somewhat different. He would be expected to take initiative, develop and oversee programming, and take his part in the teaching, preaching, and pastoral duties of a clergyperson with more independence (both here and in BG), all while still receiving regular and intentional mentoring from me.

You can tell that I am being intentionally careful and qualificatory in my language about this. There are policies and procedures and processes that must be honored, let the reader understand. However, I believed and the bishop agreed that saying something now would be wise rather than simply surprising everyone with Brian dropping in unannounced potentially very soon. In all events, of your charity, pray for our brother as he continues to prepare for the next season of his life in ministry.


#### **SERVERS**

#### LENTEN EVENSONG

As part of our Second Sunday Series, the Lenten Evensong will take place on Sunday, March 8<sup>th</sup>. Please join us at 5:00 p.m. for the choral service followed by food and fellowship.

Since the late middle ages "evensong" has been the popular name for vespers (from the Latin vesperis, "evening"), the Evening Office of the western church. Cranmer used it in the 1549 BCP. Although in 1552 he replaced it with "Evening Prayer," the common name remains "evensong." In many Anglican cathedrals and other large churches, especially in England, evensong is sung by clergy and choir as a choral liturgy.

If you have been with us in the past, we encourage you to come again; if you have never attended Evensong, come on March 8<sup>th</sup> and give it a try - we hope you will find the experience most worthwhile.
