THE RECTOR WRITES



This labor day I am reminded of the concept of Christian vocation. From the Latin *vocare* - "to call" - the term has become, perhaps, a bit too intimidating to the ordinary Christian. We might say "being a teacher for him is more a calling than a job" or "her priesthood is truly a vocation." Rarely would it occur to us to say "that fellow has a real vocation at the factory" or "she's called to be a ditch digger." There's a real, insidious elitism in how we use the words "vocation" and "call". I think that sometimes we assume that most people's "calling" is accomplished entirely outside their professions, be that in the home or in the church or through some sort of community service.

What if each of us started seeing his or her work as a vocation? What if instead of assuming that we must wait for a call to do something different we find God's work already present in our everyday tasks? The chap at the factory is providing goods for an awful lot of people. The woman digging the ditch is bringing fresh water to a once dry place or communications capabilities to people once "cut off". Almost all of us, whatever we do, are involved in work which provides something important or can potentially do so. Perhaps we can find *vocation*, our calling, right in front of us, where it didn't occur to us to look before.

For most of us, then, the task is not to fret over finding some other line of work, but in doing what we're already doing with determination and perseverance and intentionality. There is a lovely prayer from the 1928 *Book of Common Prayer*, which I believe gets to the idea I'm trying to convey and with which I'll leave you:

ALMIGHTY God, our heavenly Father, who declarest thy glory and showest forth thy handiwork in the heavens and in the earth; Deliver us, we beseech thee, in our several callings, from the service of mammon, that we may do the work which thou givest us to do, in truth, in beauty, and in righteousness, with singleness of heart as thy servants, and to the benefit of our fellow men; for the sake of him who came among us as one that serveth, thy Son, Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.




MUSIC NOTES



If there are names which should be removed, let Deborah know. If there is someone on your heart, we can add that person. Thank you!



IMPOSSIBLE PUMPKIN PIE

3/4 cup sugar 2 Tbls butter or margarine

½ cup Bisquick mix 2 eggs

13 oz. can evaporated milk 2 tsp vanilla

2 ½ tsp pumpkin pie spice 16 oz. can pumpkin

Preheat oven to 350°. Lightly grease pie plate (9 or 10")

Beat all ingredients until smooth (1 minute in blender or 2 minutes with mixer.) Pour into pie plate, bake until golden brown and knife inserted in center comes out clean - 50-55 minutes. Let cool and serve with whipped cream. Refrigerate leftover pie.
