THE RECTOR WRITES



And that I may go unto the altar of God, even unto the God of my joy and gladness;* and upon the harp will I give thanks unto thee, O God, my God. [Psalm 43:6]

There are certain phrases which have stuck in my mind and burrowed into my soul from scripture and the liturgy. They are almost invariably from Cranmer, Coverdale, and King James - not because these are necessarily objectively "superior", but because their strangeness and sonority strike one in a particularly powerful way. Chief among them is the verse from Psalm 43 above. The Psalm is employed in the traditional preparatory prayers said at the foot of the altar, both in the Latin of the old Roman Mass and in Coverdale's masterful English translation used by those of us who came up within a rather "advanced" form of the Anglo-Catholic movement in the Episcopal Church. Whether said at the foot of the altar at an "old school" celebration of the Eucharist or (more commonly for me) in the sacristy before church with the altar party, those particular words wormed their way into my consciousness at a young age and, I now believe, laid the groundwork for my vocation as a priest.

The central or foundational element of my sense of vocation was always a fervent desire to "go unto the altar of God", to simply be as close to the great mystery of the most holy Sacrament as I could be, as frequently as I could be. It is a tremendous privilege simply to be in that place, and how much more to be given the right and obligation to celebrate those holy mysteries! As a member of our diocese's Commission on Ministry I have the opportunity to meet with those discerning a call to the ordained ministry, and I always remind them (perhaps as a way of reminding myself) that every aspect of the ministry of a priest flows out of the wellspring of the sacramental role. The parts that I love about my job - preaching, teaching, providing pastoral care, representing the church in the larger community - and even the parts I might love a little less (there are lots of administrative tasks a Rector has to perform!) all find their foundation in what one does at the altar.

Here at Trinity we are reinstituting a ministry that has been in abeyance for some years, namely that of youth altar servers. We now have a critical mass of children of appropriate age to make this practicable, and I am excited about this blessing on our common life. What I said above about my own vocation notwithstanding, this is naturally not about "increasing vocations", though one should never rule that out. It is primarily about encouraging reverence and attending to the ministry of the altar (in whatever form that takes) as a good in-and-of-itself.

I remain grateful to all who serve in so many ways, both in our worship ministries and in all those pertaining to the parish's outreach, education, fellowship, and administration. With regard to the former, if you've ever thought about approaching a bit closer "even unto the God of [our] joy and gladness", never hesitate to reach out to me to see where you might be best suited to serve "in the beauty of holiness."

SIGN UP FOR KROGER COMMUNITY REWARDS
